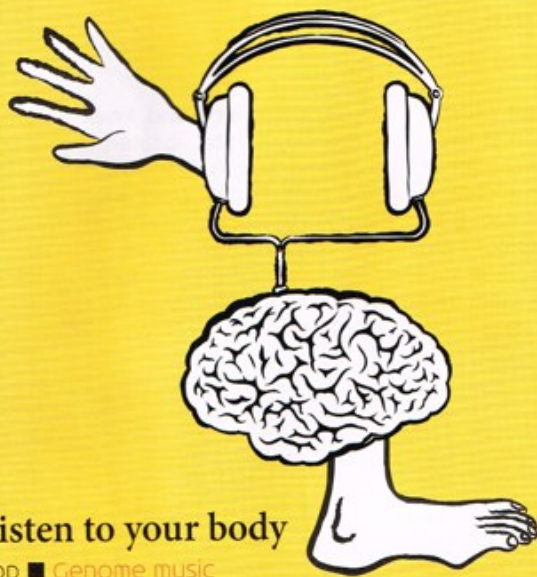

Da Vinci's handbag

Famed for genius inventions from flying machines to a steam cannon, few know that Italian Renaissance master Leonardo da Vinci was also into accessories. He drew a design for a handbag at the end of the 15th century, and this formed the inspiration for La Pretiosa (meaning 'precious'), a new bag by luxury Florentine label Gherardini. Lisa Gherardini, who is reputed to have inspired the original Mona Lisa, is believed to be a family ancestor. See gherardini.it.



Listen to your body

App ■ Genome music

This new iPhone app will not only be music to your ears, it will also be music *from* your ears, as well as your nose, legs, internal organs, in fact, your whole biological being. The GeneGroove app creates a musical melody based on your personal genome data. In total, it produces 11 different tracks based on your inner you. While the app itself is free, you first need to map your genome data via DNA testing company 23andMe (co-founded by Anne Wojcicki, wife of Google's Sergey Brin: 23andme.com).
